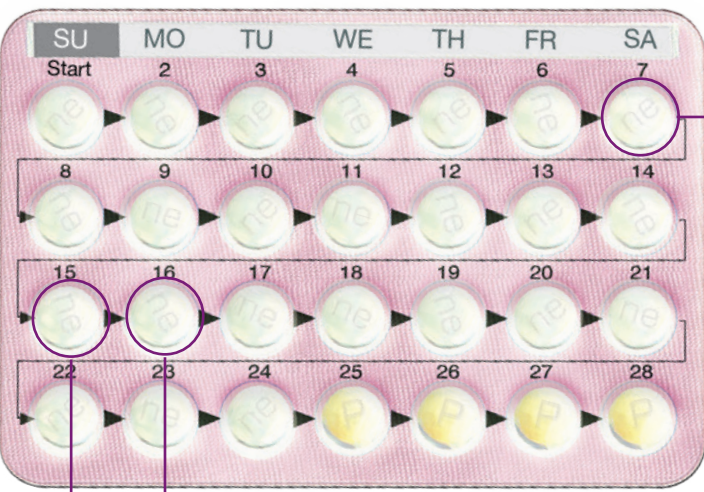


Missed a pill?

I've missed an active white tablet.

What do I do?



If you are **less than 24 hours** late in taking a white tablet:¹

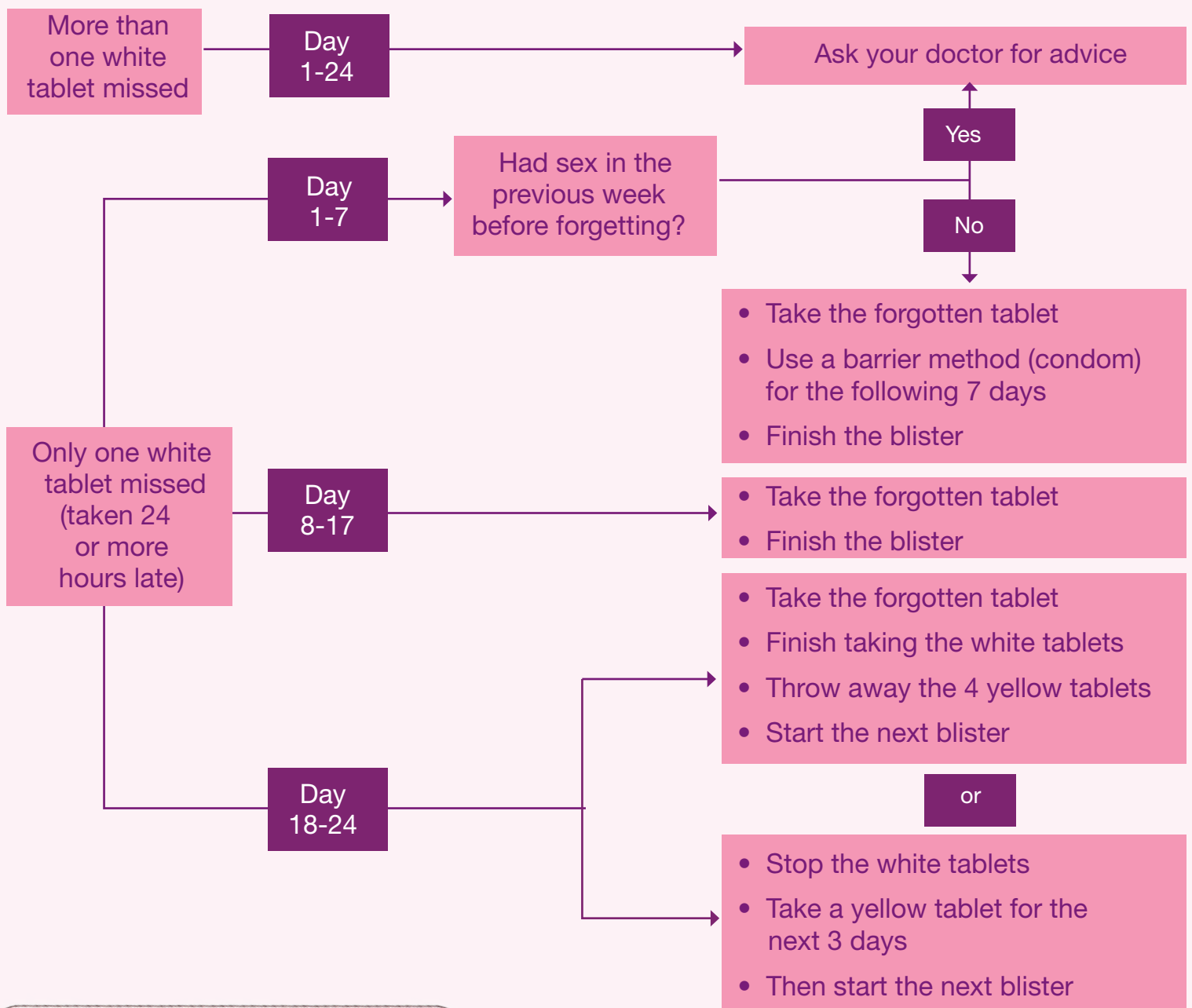
- Take the tablet as soon as you remember and take the next tablet at the usual time¹
- Your contraceptive protection is not reduced¹

If you are **24 hours/more than 24 hours** late in taking a white tablet:¹

- Contraceptive protection is reduced, which means you may fall pregnant¹
- It is important to follow the rules in the section below (Management of missed white pills)¹

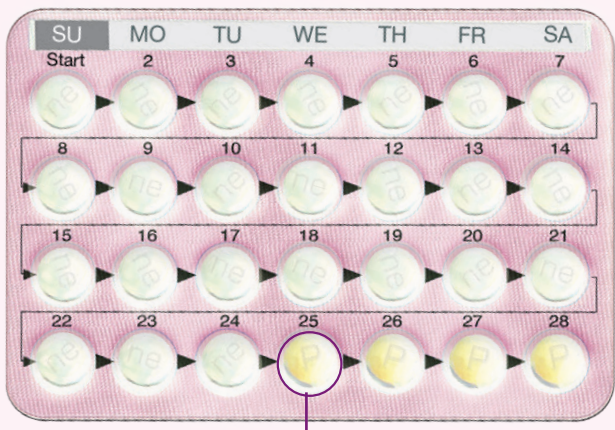


Schedule if you are 24 hours or more late in taking white tablets¹



Missed any yellow tablets?

You are still protected but you should throw away the forgotten yellow pills so you do not prolong the placebo (inactive) phase.¹



What if you cannot remember?

If you are not sure about the number or colour of tablets you missed, take extra precaution and use a barrier method until you have completed 7 consecutive days of taking the white active tablets.²
